

ZANESVILLE SENIORS' CLASSIC RULES

- A. This is to be a membership organization.
- B. Membership held to a maximum of 120.
- C. Members must be a member of a Country Club that is a member of the Ohio Golf or any state Association. Potential members may be recommended by any two members signing and submitting a proposal card. Non-members of the Seniors' Classic are not eligible to play.
- D. Membership dues will be determined annually and must be paid by all members. Dues will be mailed to each member in April and must be paid by due date as indicated.
- E. The age limit for members shall be (55) fifty-five years or more by June 30.
- F. Certified handicaps by your home Club Pro for the first year will be necessary in order to compete. After the first year, your handicap will be established from the preceding year. Full handicap will be used to determine net scores.
- G. The elected Board of Governors shall be the membership committee and approve or disapprove all applications.
- H. All classes will play white tees.

AGE CLASSIFICATION

Class A.....75 and up
Class B.....70 through 74
Class C.....65 through 69
Class D60 through 64
Class E.....55 through 59

- Prizes will be awarded to the following, but only one to a player.
- Gross Winner and Runner-up in each class.
- Low Net and Second Low Net in each class.
- The player with the Low Gross score for 36 holes will be declared *Tournament Champion*.
- The player with the second Low Gross score for 36 holes will be declared *Tournament Runner-up*.

TIE SCORES

- If a tie occurs in Low Gross for Tournament Champion, it shall be decided by a sudden death play-off.
- If ties occur in all other classes, the winners will be determined by a flip of a coin.
- The contestant's net score will consist of their total 36 hole score, less their doubled handicap.

HANDICAPS

Your handicap will be 95% of the difference between par 72 and the average 18 hole score for the 72 holes played in the Zanesville Seniors' Classic. A new member will be given 90% of his home Club handicap for his first tournament.
